





Introduction

Introduction

Hook!

- Grab the reader's attention.
- Must be on the topic of the essay.
- BE BROAD. Do not bring up the story/poem yet.

Introduction

Introduction of topic!

- Explain a little bit about the topic you will be talking about.
- You can talk about the author or what the book is about.
- You want to lead into your thesis.

Example: Edgar Allan Poe lost many people he loved to tuberculosis, but perhaps the greatest loss was his first wife, Virginia Clem. After her death, Poe wrote a poem for her that expressed his love for her and his sadness at her being taken from him.

Introduction

Thesis!

- Topic
- 3 main points
- THIS IS THE MOST IMPORTANT LINE OF THE ENTIRE PAPER.

Body Paragraph

Claim!

- Comes from your main points in your thesis.
- Introduce what this paragraph will be about.

Example: There are many images in “Annabel Lee” but the ones that is repeated the most is the sea. In this poem, the sea represents the loneliness that the narrator feels at the death of Annabel Lee.

Body Paragraph

Cite!

- Quote that backs up your claim.
- This must support the statement you made in your topic sentence.
- MLA IN TEXT CITATION

Example: In “Annabel Lee,” the narrator describes the love of his life and how she is taken away from him. Not wanting to lose her even though she is already gone, he lays by her grave. Poe writes,
“And so, all the night-tide, I lie down by the side
Of my darling-my darling-my life and my bride,
In her sepulchre by the sea
In her tomb by the sounding sea” (Poe 1).

Body Paragraph

Clarify!

- Explain how your quote backs up your claim.
- Make sure this all connects to your thesis.
- Be clear in your explanation!

Example: One can see that the narrator is devastated by this loss. As he lays by her tomb, the reader can imagine the vast ocean next to him, representing loneliness and emptiness. In the beginning, the sea was where their kingdom was but now that Annabel Lee is gone, the narrator is left there alone. Therefore, the sea symbolizes the emptiness he feels now that she is gone.

- Remind the reader of the topic of this essay.

Example: Edgar Allan Poe's "Annabel Lee" uses several symbols to tell a story.

Conclusion

Summarize main points!

- Review the points you made in different words.

Example: In the poem, the sea represents the loneliness and emptiness he feels at her loss while the angels represent anger and death because he portrays them as Annabel's killers. The wind serves as a symbol for the disease of tuberculosis, a disease that killed many people Poe was close to.

Conclusion

Final impression!

- If the reader had read nothing else, what would you want them to remember?

Example: Each symbol comes together to tell the tale of a man who is experiencing the many phases of grief after losing the love of his life.
